On or about October 11 2022 I received a decision from CRA that I
had been
ineligible for 25500 dollars worth of CRB payments that I had
received. The applicant makes application for: relief of all the burden of
repayment for the 25500 dollars

The grounds for the application are: all eligibility requirements were met and proof of
income was provided and the determination was still made that I owe the money back
because I was unable to provide the 1 years worth of paystubs from my former
employer in 2021. I submit that I provided sufficient information to prove that I met
the minimum requirements to be eligible for the CRB payments and the CRA is
assuming that I made fraudulent claims based on ambiguous information on my tax
records.
