Appeal

<u>THE APPELLANT APPEALS</u> to the Federal Court of Appeal for complete relief from the Court Order issued by <u>Judge Roger R. Lafrenièr</u>, on <u>October 27</u>, <u>2023</u>; by which the Appellant's Application for Judicial review (<u>filed on October 25th</u>, <u>2022</u>), was dismissed.

On October 25th, 2022, the Appellant requested a Judicial review of two (2) decisions made in July 2022, by the Canada Emergency Benefits Validation Department of the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA), whereby the Appellant was found to be ineligible for the Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB) and the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) payments that he received in 2020 and 2021.

THE APPELLANT ASKS that the Order issued by <u>Judge Roger R. Lafrenièr</u>, to Dismiss the Appellant's Judicial Review, be overturned Effective Immediately, and that said Judicial review be allowed to resume.

THE APPELLANT'S GROUNDS OF APPEAL ARE AS FOLLOWS:

The Appellant spoke with a Court Registry Agent on October 27, 2022, and the Registry Agent informed the Appellant that the Appellant would be notified of the hearing date that the Court would subsequently establish, and that said hearing date would likely be delayed for several weeks, due to the vast backlog of cases that the Court was occupied with at that time.

In addition, the Appellant did Not receive any Subsequent notice whatsoever, from Court Registry Agents, about the **November 25, 2022** deadline to serve the Applicant's Affidavit evidence and file Proof of service, until the **Notice of Status Review issued by Associate Judge Coughlan**, was received by the Appellant on **June 28th, 2023**.

When the Appellant responded to the above-mentioned **Notice of Status Review**, by asking why the Court had allowed such a Prolonged period of time to Lapse, without any form of follow-up by the Court, the Appellant was NOT provided with an explanation that the Appellant truly believed was fair and/or reasonable.

Throughout the duration of this Judicial review, the Court's Registry Agents have repeatedly failed to properly inform the Appellant of the Appropriate rules, Mandatory steps, and/or Documents that the Appellant was required to follow and/or Submit, in order to proceed with the Judicial review process in a timely manner.

The above-mentioned failures of Court Registry Agents to provide the Appellant with Accurate and Relevant information, combined with the Appellant's lack of experience in Judicial review and Legal matters, placed the Appellant in a Severely Disadvantaged Legal position, compared to the Legal position that was held by the Attorney General of Canada (the Respondent).

The Appellant has reason to believe that <u>Judge Roger R. Lafrenièr</u> did not accept or acknowledge the repetitive failures of Court Registry Agents to provide the Appellant with Accurate and Relevant information in a timely manner that was necessary for the Appellant to proceed with said Judicial Review, and by doing so, <u>Judge Lafrenièr</u> failed to observe an Appropriate level of Procedural Fairness.

The Appellant also believes that <u>Judge Lafrenièr</u> based his decision to dismiss the Appellant's Judicial Review Application on Erroneous findings and/or a basic disregard for Factual materials that the Appellant had provided to the Court.

In closing, I humbly and respectfully ask that the <u>Federal Court of Appeal</u> consider the information that I have presented here in this Appeal, and to render a decision that is Balanced and Equitable to all the parties involved.
